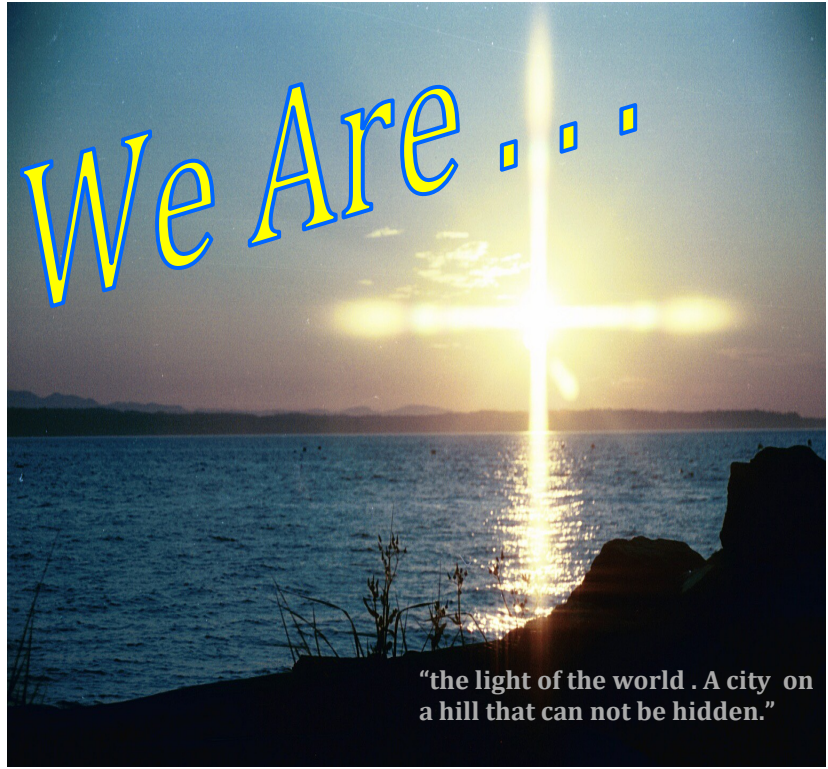

Keith & Debbie Myers Missionaries to Mexico

Debbie and Keith serve in Central Mexico. They partner with the Council of Rural Indigenous Evangelicals of Mexico, AR, (CICEM) to provide pastoral accompaniment to the indigenous churches. This consists of training pastors, church leaders, youth leaders and teachers for the children. Debbie and Keith serve in four states in Mexico and work with 34 churches within these states to empower the people. The individuals they serve speak Spanish and seven other languages.



Juan & Denise Aragon Missionaries to Mexico

Denise and Juan will serve in partnership with the Council of Rural Indigenous Evangelicals of Mexico (Consejo Indígena Campesino Evangélico de México, CICEM) in Chiapas, Mexico. They will both work in training, prevention and education as they learn the community needs and look for ways to emotionally and economically empower leaders in their communities. Juan will focus on theological education and leadership training as he accompanies, coaches and disciples new church leaders. Denise's ministry will seek to empower women, especially those who are victims of domestic abuse. Languages used in ministry: Spanish, Tzeltal and Tzotzil.

She assists in the development of the Guest House facilities and in the marketing of livelihood products, such as jewelry, and greeting cards. STM provides a safe, comforting place for women to BE. For the most part, these women have never been in relationships that encourage them to be themselves. They have never known people who accepted them as they are. They have always been "the giver" in relationships, not "the receiver." They have never had long-term friendships. Samaritana assists these women as they develop many relationships that will last a lifetime, and one that will last through Eternity.
