

West Virginia American Baptist Women's Ministries Funds

Thank you for giving to AB Women's Ministries of West Virginia. Your monetary gifts and prayers support ministries in West Virginia, nationally and internationally.

Contributions to AB Women's Ministries projects must be sent through the following channels:



If you send money for Special Project, National Support, Mission Outreach Project, Scholarship, etc. directly to the WVBC office, you cannot get recognition through AB Women's Ministries of WV. Money must come through the association AB Women's Ministries treasurer to the state AB Women's Ministries treasurer.

To qualify as a **Blue Ribbon Church** and be listed on the **Honor Roll of Churches** all contributions to Special Project, National Annual Support, Mission Outreach Project and Scholarship must be sent to the association AB Women's Ministries treasurer by December 15th and AB Women's Ministries of West Virginia treasurer by December 27th.

Make all <u>checks</u> payable to: AB Women's Ministries of WV Contributions received <u>after December 27th</u> will be applied to next year's report.

SPECIAL PROJECT -- The Special Project Committee chooses a ministry within West Virginia such as: Parchment Valley, Weirton Christian Center, Camp Cowen, etc. The Coordinator of Church and Community sends quotas for each association to the association president.

NATIONAL ANNUAL SUPPORT (NAS or NATIONAL SUPPORT) -- National American Baptist Women's Ministries uses 100 percent of your gift to provide ministries to empower women and girls to serve Christ. The National AB Women's Ministries provides programs, resources and leader training for women and girls in West Virginia and other states/regions across the United States and Puerto Rico. More information can be obtained by going to: www.abministries.org.

MISSION OUTREACH PROJECT (MOP) -- The Mission Outreach Project Committee chooses a ministry recommended by one of our international missionaries. No suggested quotas are sent to the associations.

SCHOLARSHIP/LOAN FUND -- The Scholarship/Loan Fund supports eligible women going to West Virginia accredited colleges or universities. Applications are received by the Coordinator of Scholarship. The Scholarship Committee considers all applications. Recipients are recommended to the AB Women's Ministries Board of WV for vote. The amount a young woman receives each year is determined by the amount of money received the previous year from: 1) contributions, 2) scholarship repayments and 3) interest.

"Live Your Passion." This month, over 8,000 athletes from 207 nations will live this motto at the summer Olympic Games in Rio through 28 sports. The Olympics is an international event and a symbol of continuity of people from six continents. In a sermon by the Bishop of Pennsylvania during the 1908 London games, he said "the most important thing is not to win, but to take part." One cannot win without entering the race. We can parallel this to our spiritual life. We first need to seek God's will, then follow the paths set before us. However, it is not a race to win. It is the desire to be obedient and leave spiritual footprints along the way.

Before the games begin, the Olympic torch is lit in Greece. Then it begins the journey to the host city. Our desire to seek God is like a flame burning inside of us, and our yearning to be more like Him burns along our spiritual journey. Sometimes the Olympic flame burns out, but it is relit along the way. Our lives can sometimes get messy and our spiritual flame can suffer, but through faith and prayer, we can reignite our passion and continue on our journey. Christ is our Light and His passion for us never waivers.

Over the venues for the games, the Olympic flag with the five rings will be raised. There are five colors, representing the five continents (the Americas are combined.) The colors can remind us of life in Christ:

- blue for Christ, our Living Water
- green for growth through the Holy Spirit
- black for our sinful nature

WHAT'S NEW WITH OUR WEST VIRGINIA MISSIONARY PARTNERS?

Keith & Debbie Myers -- Mexico/Chicken Project



This project seeks to raise \$44,319 by June 2016. The funds will provide 160 families in the southern states of Mexico each with 24 chickens, chicken feed, incubators and materials to build chicken coops. The purpose of the project is to help these indigenous people become self-sufficient and have a steady source of protein. The mobile tractors (chicken coops) are now available.

Josefe is holding an egg from one of the chickens she raises. Your gifts will provide a coop so that during the rainy season her chickens won't be washed away. The chickens will not only help feed Josefe's family but also enable her to supply meat and eggs for

church events. In 2015, WV AB Women's Ministries raised approximately \$24,000 to help with this project!

Debbie Mulneix -- Philippines/Samaritana Transformation Ministries

Debbie supports the anti-human trafficking work of Samaritana Transformation Ministries (STM) in Manila, the Philippines. She assists in the development of the Guest House facilities and the marketing of livelihood products, such as jewelry and greeting cards.



STM provides a safe, comforting place for women to BE. For the most part, these women have never been in relationships that encourage them to be themselves. They have never known people who accepted them as they are. They have always been "the giver" in relationships, not "the receiver." They have never had long-term friend-

ships. Samaritana assists these women, as they develop many relationships that will last a lifetime, and one that will last through eternity. In February 2016, ten AB women from West Virginia went on a mission trip to minister to the women at STM. Debbie made a wonderful video about this mission trip.

J. D. and Rhonda Reed -- Home Assignment Ending



It has been a busy, but full eight months for the Reed family as they have been back in the United States for their home assignment year. It was a blessing for them to visit many churches and share how God is working in Bolivia.

They are pleased to let their missionary family know Rhonda has just completed her first year of her Master's Degree in Global Public Health Nursing at Cedarville University. At the end of the year, as a recognition of her hard work, Cedarville recognized her and gave her a small institutional scholarship. J.D. has begun working

on his Doctorate of Ministry in Contextual Theology at Northern Theological Seminary. Please be in prayer for them, as they work on their studies and they return to Bolivia.

Guest Speaker: Kim Weaver, Executive Director, Weirton Christian Center





Communication

When we think of communications in women's ministry, we think about how we might promote our meetings, keep our officers informed, invite others to join us for meetings, a prayer chain and announcements in the church bulletin. You get the picture. Communications is all about staying in contact with our women...right? Well, that is part of it. But what about your communication with God? You, whether you are a leader or a follower, need to be in constant communication with God to know what He has in mind for you to do. Posted on Pinterest recently was this saying, "God will lead you where He wants you to be, but you have to talk to Him daily to see where He wants you to go. The key is prayer." Here are some easy ways to stay in touch with your Heavenly Father.

- Take five minutes in the quietest part of your day to talk to God. That may mean getting up five minutes earlier or going to bed five minutes later or using five minutes of your lunch hour. Find that extra five minutes where it works for you.
- Instead of you doing all the talking, spend time listening.
- Use scripture as a guide to help you pray and listen: Psalm 34:4
 - I Thessalonians 5:17 James 5:16 Matthew 6:9-13 Jeremiah 29:12 Romans 8:26 I Corinthians 14:15 Matthew 26:41
- Keep a prayer basket. This is not a new idea but one that bears repeating. Fill a basket with a Bible, a journal, note cards, pen, tissues, candle and devotional. Keep the basket in your favorite prayer spot and it will be available to you whenever you come to prayer time. Seeing it will remind you that you need to take time to pray.
- Remove all distractions before coming to prayer. Turn off the television and put your phone in another room. Rather than using the Bible app on your phone, how about using a paper Bible so you will not be interrupted by text messages or phone calls.

Remember, when you go to prayer, you may think you are inviting God to be present. But in reality, this is God's invitation to you to spend time with Him!!

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4:6

Hospitality

Anytime during the year is a good time to throw an Operation Christmas Child party. At our church, we are asked to bring small items all through the year for the shoe box project. Large boxes placed throughout the church remind us there will come that special time to pack shoe boxes. The goal is to pack 100 extra boxes besides the ones individuals bring for the project.

Why not have an Operation Christmas Child party? It can be anytime. Have as many guests, any age, as you can handle. Each guest brings 12 of the same item (soap, combs, toothbrush, crayons, toy cars, small stuffed animals, etc.) You can email Samaritan's Purse (www.samaritanspurse.org) and they will send you the boxes already decorated and a video of their ministry.

Start the party by watching the video as a group while someone lays all the items on a table. After the video, talk to your guests about what will happen to the shoe boxes and how sending them to destinations for children will be showing Jesus to children around the world. The guests take a shoe box and walk around the table choosing items to fill it.

Have some refreshments, make a card to go in the shoe box and then gather in a circle and have prayer for the children who will receive the shoe boxes. The nice thing about this party is that it is a giving party. No one goes home with a treat bag.

This could be done as a birthday party for a child, or at a family reunion as an activity, or as a get together in your neighborhood. The fun is doing something for others in an easy, simple way. AND, it might not even be stressful!

How do you see your role as a good leader? Take the "True or False" test below:

- T F A good leader will raise questions, draw out ideas and help get them implemented.
- T F Leadership involves servanthood performing chores and accepting blame.

All were true. In fact, our job as leaders involves initiating, stimulating, inspiring, harmonizing, guiding, evaluating, informing, questioning and being a servant.

To this day, we could not do what we do without the support and "MISSION MINDS" of our Baptist family. We could not do what we do, if it weren't for the hearts and generosity of our Baptist family.

for their daily attendance, homework completion and report cards. We survive only on

donations. The collections of paper products, cleaning supplies and afterschool snacks mean so much to us. Each year, we value our in-kind support of items we need at close to \$20,000. Pine Grove, Parkersburg Association, just delivered their annual batch of school supplies. Our children depend on us for these items year round. We have come to depend on the Radabaughs and a few groups who bring us paper products and afterschool snacks.

Our White Cross from the AB women has become so much a part of our ministry. The donation room is stocked in case someone needs diapers, baby items, underwear, socks, clothing and school supplies. The stamps we receive get us through the year. The Knot-Heads and Knit -Wits from Saint Albans provide us with quilts, hats and gloves each year. Beulah Ann's Sew-Blast Club provided handmade pillowcases for camp and South Parkersburg ladies brought us a load of camping supplies for hygiene kits. The women from Simpson Creek hand-delivered their White Cross donation in March. We love it when we get to spend time with you. The gift cards your groups provide enable us to get what our kids need, when they need it – in the right size, or help their families with something they desperately need. Then there are the WORKERS! This year, we had a group of amazing young people from New Baptist Church in Huntington come to the center, led by Lee Boso. They worked around the center fixing, planting, sorting and creating the hygiene kits for camp, organizing donations in the basement and painting EVERY room in the main building. Their creativity was amazing. They turned one room into the outside of a church building. They had such an awesome spirit of love and helpfulness.

In order for them to spend time with some of our kids, we took our Scripture Contest winners to Kennywood Park and they got to spend one-on-one time mentoring them. What a great experience! We cannot wait for them to come back. We welcome any group who would like to take a mission trip to either help with tasks at the Center or work with our children. Once the new building goes up, there will



be much painting and finishing work to do!

We cannot thank American Baptist Women's Ministries of West Virginia enough for choosing our new preschool as your Special Project. May God bless richly bless you for all you do for so many!

Did you know.....? 2016 is the 65th Anniversary of American Baptist Women's Ministries!

In 1953, the National Council of American Baptist Women was formed to create a national organization to which each American Baptist woman could belong, and to expand the ministry to include the total mission of the church, including missions with women in the United States, Puerto Rico and all over the world. Women wanted to be able to elect their own officers and chairperson who could focus their energy on the needs of American Baptist women and all that these women could accomplish by working together. They also wanted a focus on leadership development of women to develop a greater capacity for ministry and mission.

Several national mission projects launched by American Baptist Women/AB Women's Ministries have led to the betterment of the lives of women and girls.

- In 1977, AB women contributed \$134,610 to the mission project, "Water Without Walking," to provide pump sets to make pure water easily accessible to women in India, Haiti and other countries. The amount raised exceeded the highest expectations by 500%.
- In 1996, AB women raised funds to build the Mitendi Center in Kinshasa, D.R. Congo, Africa, where the Congolese Baptist women teach sewing, health, hygiene and job skills to help women who are single mothers and women coming out of prostitution.
- Between 2007-2013, AB women raised \$515,651 for "Break the Chains: Slavery in the 21th Century." Funds were granted to ministries engaged in the abolition of sex trafficking, victim care and support and prevention. This project exceeded the original goal by over 200%.

Bible Books of the Month for 2017

January 2017 Hosea

The Lord spoke to Hosea saying, "Go, take for yourself a wife of whoredome, and have children of whoredome for the land commits great whoredome by forsaking the Lord." Hosea 1:2 (NRSV).

Hosea's name means "Salvation: deliverance." He suffered a tragedy in marrying an adulteress, whom he loved in spite of her sinful ways. He tries to compare God's love for Israel to that of a loyal husband for his disloval wife.

February 2017 Philemon

"I am appealing to you for my child Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment." Philemon 1:10 (NSRV).

Paul is writing to his friend, Philemon, on behalf of the runaway slave, Onesimus, who accepted Christ and decided to return to slavery. Paul appeals to Philemon to accept Onesimus as a beloved brother.

March 2017 Ezra

The king spoke to Ezra saying, "And you, Ezra, according to the God-given wisdom you possess, appoint persons who know the laws of your God to serve as judges, and you will teach those who do not know them." Ezra 7:25 (NSRV).

Ezra's name means "The Help," and true to his name, he gathered people who returned to rebuild the temple. After 70 years in captivity, the Jews returned to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple.

April 2017 Nehemiah

Nehemiah prayed. "Lord let your ear be attentive to the prayer of your servants who delight in revering your name." Nehemiah 1:11 (NSRV).

Nehemiah, whose name means "God is Comfort," was cupbearer (a very high position) to King Artaxerxes. He was given permission to return to Jerusalem, and inspired the men to work.

May 2017 Judges

After the death of Joshua, the Israelites inquired of God, "Who shall go up first for us against the Canaanites, to fight against them?" Judges 1:1 (NSRV).

Twelve people were chosen by God to judge, vindicate, punish and govern Israel during this period in their history.

June 2017 1 & 2 Thessalonians

"We always give thanks to God for you, and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith, and labor of love, and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ."

1 Thessalonians 1:4 (NSRV).

In Paul's letter we see an excellent model of tactful counsel to Christians young in the faith. They were undergoing great persecutions, and Paul was concerned about their ability to withstand.

July 2017

Psalms 1-72 Happy are those who do not follow the advice of

the wicked, or take the path that sinners tread, or sit in the seat of scoffers. Psalms 1:1 (NSRV).

Psalms, the "praise" book, is the largest book in the Bible, comprised of 150 poems.

These sacred lyrical poems were written in unrhymed Hebrew verse that was set to music and arranged for worship in the temple.

1 Samuel August 2017

As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him, and let none of his words fall to the ground. 1 Samuel 3:19 (NSRV).

Samuel was devoted to the service of the Lord from an early age when his mother, Hannah, brought him to the temple and gave him to Eli, the priest. While serving as one of the judges to Israel, the people came asking for a king like their neighbors. Samuel refused until God instructed him to grant them their wish.

September 2017 Ephesians

"I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus, and of your love toward all the saints, and for this reason, I do not cease to give thanks for you, and I remember you in my prayers." Ephesians 1:15-16 (NSRV).

In this letter, Paul addresses family concerns; explains the need for church officers in building up the body of Christ; and tells of the calling of the nations to share with believing Jews as joint heirs in the body of Christ.

October 2017 2 Samuel

"King David prayed, "Who am I, O Lord God, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far?" 2 Samuel 7:18 (NSRV).

Second Samuel gives the history of Israel following the death of Saul, Israel's first king, and introduces David, who becomes king, "as the anointed of God."

November 2017 Habakkuk

Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vine; though the produce of the olive fails, and the fields yield no food; though the flock is cut off from the fold, and there is no herd in the stalls; yet will I rejoice in the Lord. Habakkuk 3:17 (NRSV).

Habakkuk describes the disasters that might occur in the land, but believers must keep faith in an everlasting God who loves them.

December 2017 John

For God so loved the world that He gave His only son, so that everyone who believes in God shall not perish, but have eternal life. John 3:16 (NSRV).

John's gospel reveals the "Word," who was in the beginning with God, as the "One" through whom all things were created. He uses the word "love" more than the other three Gospel writers.
