Suggestions For Using WorkLife in Your Church

- 1. Learn about the WorkLife and its resources. Read the Monday Morning Atheist (provided by the West Virginia Baptist Convention).
- 2. Go to the WorkLife website, <u>www.worklife.org</u> and learn about what Worklife has to offer. Be sure to check out the tabs for workers and for the church. There is a doctoral thesis online too!
- 3. Order and download the PDF file titled, Church WorkLife Guide. Read the guide in light of the personality and situation of your congregation.
- 4. Schedule when you will begin the six-week WorkLife study titled <u>The Switch</u>. We encourage each church to start as early as January 2018.
- 5. Order a <u>Switch Kit</u> for each person participating in the study. Kits can be ordered online through WorkLife.org for bulk pricing.
- 6. Those participating can also sign up for six weekly texts free from WorkLife. Instructions are in the Switch Kits.
- 7. Order <u>Thrive Guides</u> (see online). These can be used as bulletin inserts or given out at services. You also have them sent via email to those participating. Prices are online.
- 8. Recruit participants for the **FREE** online WorkLife Work Tools. A registration form is included.
- 9. Plan when you will be delivering messages or having small group studies focused on workers, the theology of the work, work as worship, thriving at work, facing challenges at work, etc. WorkLife materials can give you many suggestions. Again, this is a year-long study and focus!
- 10. Schedule and plan an event celebrating the ministry of work and how it can change your community.
