


MEET YOUR NEW OFFICERS FOR 2018

- ⇒ Follow Andy Stanley https://youtu.be/RcSGXUf2W2o. In this eight-part series, Andy Stanley takes us on a journey through the Gospels as he traces Jesus' teachings on what it means to follow. For many, the Christian life feels like a long game of "Jesus Says." Jesus says pray. Jesus says give. Jesus says go to church. But upon further investigation, we discover that Jesus' invitation to His first-century audience was an invitation to relationship. And it began with a simple request follow me.
- ⇒ Our God Is Indescribable Louie Giglio https://youtu.be/oNgJhulCrVA. He helps us attempt to comprehend how big our own galaxy is, not to mention HOW BIG our God is! The heavens are telling the glory of God and their expanse declares the work of His hands. Night after night they remind us of just how small we are and how huge God is. Just a glimpse of one of the billions of visible galaxies He has formed resizes us, shrinking us, and the world we call home, to seeming insignificance in an instant. But as tiny as we may seem, the God who knows every star by name also knows yours and mine. And in the most stunning rescue imaginable, God sent His Son to this spinning planet we call home--the Creator reconnecting us to Himself with life that never ends.

Lysa shares her own deeply personal experiences with rejection from the incredibly painful childhood abandonment by her father to the perceived judgment of the perfectly toned woman one elliptical over. Connect, Make Friends and Pray!

As leaders, one of the "unwritten" rules is to be on the lookout for new ideas. The September 2017 issue of *Leader's Reader*, published by the national board of American Baptist Women's Ministries, shared this idea that is worthy of your consideration.

Relationships matter! The women of one church recently cultivated relationships when they started something they call "3-4-1": three women, four months, one purpose. It's simple. Three women connect regularly for four months with the singular purpose of supporting each other, growing in faith and praying for one another.

Women in the congregation were invited to sign up for 3-4-1, providing their contact information. They were then matched up into triads, and effort was made to connect people who didn't know one another (unless they had specifically asked to be paired with friends whose names they provided). Preference was given to cross-generational pairings. Women in the triads were notified by email, so they instantly had one another's contact information. Each triad met face to face within the first month to get acquainted and share prayer concerns. They then agreed to check in with one another via email by a pre-arranged weekly deadline. They also meet face-to-face once a month, for four months.

A few simple ground rules were offered: confidentiality, resisting advice giving, and balancing out the sharing so that no one person dominated the conversation. With that, the groups were off and running. If you are looking for something simple and easy to connect women, try 3-4-1. Call it whatever you want, but just make it possible for women to connect, make friends and pray!



This short-term prayer focus will allow women from your church to know each other better, lean on each other and build strong relationships. When creating small prayer groups mix circle women with women not in AB Women's Ministries. Building relationships in these small groups may just bring new members into your women's group.

COMMUNICATIONS

My mother could always communicate her feelings with her big, brown eyes! My father could just look a certain way, and I knew I hadn't done the right thing. My expressions came through pouting and sitting on the couch, and refusing to talk to anyone! Remember those days, ladies?

Now that I am an adult, I still communicate through facial expressions of: anger, fear, joy, sadness, surprise. Now that I am an adult, I don't sit on the couch and sulk, but I still express by yawning, finger tapping, shoulder shrug, crossing my arms or just by ignoring.

Let's remember some important points in communicating:

- Be positive and upbeat with your facial expressions
- Use words of compassion and encouragement

- * Showing enthusiasm to be with them
- * Having a smile ready
- Hugging is acceptable

If a lady in your gathering is missing due to illness or a personal situation, why don't you lift her up by doing the following —and more than one time!

- Send her a note of encouragement by email or by mail
- Phone calls are great
- Prayers
- Drop off some cookies or mail a care package
