The Book of Romans

Purpose of the Course:

This course is an introduction to the biblical letter of Paul to the Romans. The primary purpose of the course is to help prepare students for further study of this book.

Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course you should:

1.) Be familiar with the structure of a Pauline letter.

 $\hat{2.}$) Be able to successfully identify and explain the "argument" of Romans.

3.) Be aware of current interpretive issues surrounding this book.

4.) Be equipped with a basic knowledge of the authorship, structure and content of the book of Romans.

Required Text:

The student should pick one:

The NIV Application Commentary on Romans by Douglas Moo or The Tyndale New Testament Commentary on Romans by F.F. Bruce

Course Method:

This course will involve primarily four activities, which are as follows: (Note: These are your assignments.)

- 1.) Attend the class
- 2.) Read the book of Romans. Read one of the two commentaries.

3.) Write a book review on the textbook.

a.) Two-four pages double spaced, Times New Roman 12pt font

b.) This paper is a **reaction** to what you have read and not a summary of the text.

c.) Submit in person on the day of the class (January 12, 2019) or by e-mail to the address of the instructor, Mark McCloy, at mccloy@wvbc.org.

4.) Discussion - participate in class discussions.

All work is to be submitted within a month of the class day (February 12, 2019).
