<p>Relational Wisdom 360</p> <p>This workshop could change every relationship in your life! Relational wisdom is your ability to discern emotions and interests in yourself and in others, to interpret them in the light of God's word, and to use these insights to manage your responses and relationships constructively. These relational skills will enable you to experience closer relationships and less conflict with your spouse, children and extended family. They can enrich your friendships and church life. You can also take them into the workplace, where they can improve job performance, team-building and career advancement.</p>	<p>Healing Church Hurt</p> <p>Thirty-seven percent of unchurched Americans say they do not go to church because of negative past experiences with church people. Come learn what the church can do to heal those who have been hurt by the church.</p>
<p>Youth Ministry - Connecting with Students by Teaching Like Jesus</p> <p>Jim Rayburn, the founder of Young Life, said, "It is a sin to bore a kid with the gospel." When we teach like Jesus taught, we are going to connect in life-changing ways that won't bore.</p>	<p>Young Adult Ministry - How to Come Alongside 18 to 25 Year-Olds for Discipleship in this Post-Christian World in Which We Live.</p> <p>Alderson Broadbent University and Philippi Baptist Church (Union) have entered into a grant-funded year of ministry development that involves discovering creative and experiential approaches for Gen Z (18-25 year-olds) faith formation within the context of a partnership between an affiliated ABC/USA University and Church in a rural Appalachian context (Philippi).
