Happy 2020! A NEW BEGINNING!

As a teacher, I love the first day of school. I always impress upon my students that they have been given another chance to change bad habits and continue to improve for another year of study. The past can make us better students if we learn from it! Isn't that also true as Christians? How great that our God is a God of second chances over and over again. No matter how many times we mess up, He never stops loving His children, always offering forgiveness and a new beginning in our walk with Him.

ABWM of WV has been given a new year of opportunities to bring Jesus to this hurting, broken world. I recently heard Pastor David Bush at Crab Orchard Baptist Church in Beckley speak on Hebrews 10:22-25. Through his passionate delivery of God's word, I grabbed onto this scripture as the perfect formula to start the new year as servants of Jesus Christ.



Hebrews 10:22 (NKJV) - "LET US DRAW NEAR with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil

conscience and our bodies washed with pure water." I love that this verse is before the others. How do we draw near? Notice it requires action on our part - take time to read God's word and meditate on it, pray, be still so we can hear Him speak to us in the depths of our hearts - to draw near in an intimate love relationship with God. We are promised in James 4:8 "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you . . ." How else can we weather the storms of life and still have peace beyond understanding? Disappointment and frustration will come at times as you serve Jesus through the women's ministries. But staying near to God will help us walk by faith, knowing that God is with us every step of the way.

Hebrews 10:23 (NKJV) – "LET US HOLD FAST the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful." Pioneer missionary Adoniram Judson traveled to Burma (now Myanmar) in 1813. After six years of sharing the gospel at great personal sacrifice, not one Burmese had trusted in Christ. Yet, God tells us to hold on without wavering. Then, in 1819, the first Burmese convert believed that Jesus suffered death for his sins and was baptized. Today, there are more than two million believers in Myanmar (Burma), and 40% of the Karen people to whom Adoniram Judson directed his ministry are now Christians. We, too, have been called to serve in various positions throughout ABWM of WV. It is easy to become discouraged when we work hard to minister to our women locally or at our state gatherings and attendance is less than expected. But God says to hold on because He is faithful! I Corinthians 3:6 reminds us that sowing is our responsibility and the results are God's.

Hebrews 10:24 (NKJV) – "And LET US CONSIDER ONE ANOTHER IN ORDER TO STIR UP LOVE AND GOOD WORKS, . . ." Elizabeth Johnson Carter stirred up love and good works after reading a plea for supplies from the wife of a missionary in India who was ministering to women held in seclusion. Mrs. Carter's efforts led to organizing circles of women across West Virginia in the late 1800s to help meet the needs of missionaries on the field. Elizabeth Johnson Carter became the first state president of what is now ABWM of WV. Our organization of women's ministries is one of the strongest across the nation. Why is that? To be successful as servants of our Lord Jesus Christ, let's follow this formula from Hebrews:

> LET US draw near to God, LET US hold fast without wavering, and LET US meet the needs of others with love and good works!

Ladies,

As the new State Executive Board First Vice President, I find it exciting to be in charge of the WV Hope project. This ministry will give American Baptist Women an opportunity to help those in our association areas, thus giving it a personal touch! Let's give our new ministries prayers and sincere thoughts. When this ministry was created in 2019, we first had to determine if this alternative to White Cross would be well received and thankfully it was. We also knew there would have to be adjustments made as we went along and this message is to make you aware of those changes that were put into place at the State Board Meeting in November.

- Beginning in 2021 the term for the ministries will be from January December. This is to streamline this ministry
 to conform with the same time frame as our Mission Outreach Project, Special Project and Love Gift, all of which consume a calendar year.
- The ministries in place now, which normally would change in June 2020, will stay the same until the end of December 2020. This will give you a longer time to meet your goals for collection.
- Your new ministries will be in your association packets handed out on Women's Day 2020, and will be effective January 2021 December 2021.
- Your year-end reports are due to association officers by January 15th and then to me, WV Hope Coordinator, by January 30th.
- Weirton Christian Center will always remain as one of the yearly recipients of our WV Hope Ministries.
- If you have *ministries in your area* that might need our assistance, please get those to me by April 15, 2020.
- My committee and I will meet during the Annual Conference in June to determine both the number of ministries and the ministries to be selected for 2021.

Camp Alpha is a church camp located in Ryazan, Russia who hosted their first campers in 2017. The camp currently consists of two picnic shelters, two large metal storage containers repurposed into cabins and outhouses for restroom facilities. Tents provide additional housing for the campers. Meals must either be brought in from local churches or cooked on-site over an open campfire. Taking into account the rustic nature of the camp, it's amazing that 65 kids were in attendance in 2019! The WVBC partnership with the Russian churches has helped them to create the camp in resemblance to our very own Camp Cowen and Parchment Valley.

The American Baptist Women's Ministries of West Virginia have adopted Camp Alpha for their MOP 2020 project. We hope our goal of \$6,000 will help make improvements to the camp that will encourage more children to come meet Jesus at Camp Alpha!

WV HOPE CONTINUATION . . . We traveled to Quinwood to interview a stranger and returned with not only a friend but a relative!



In August, President Debbie Higginbotham, President-Elect Kathy Hudson, Secretary Karen Nicholson and Communication Coordinator Sue Hamric traveled to Quinwood, West Virginia (Greenbrier County) for a road trip that will be etched in our memories forever. We had received information that in addition to the Dunbar First Baptist Church relic, there was another bench from the Herald of Hope Chapel Car located at **Quinwood First Baptist Church (Hopewell Association)** in the town of the same name. To add to that excitement, information surfaced that there was a member of the Quinwood First Baptist Church whose family had actually worshipped on the Herald of Hope Chapel Car. Thus the road trip was scheduled and we set out to interview **Charlotte Johnson**.

Charlotte and her friend, Patsy McClung, met us at the Quinwood First Baptist Church and provided us with a history of the church. Charlotte, a member for many years, attended worship services with her family on the Herald of Hope Chapel Car, although she has no recollection of that attendance as she was only a small child and the youngest of four children. We learned a great deal about this fascinating lady --- she was born in 1931; attended Camp Cowen the first year that it opened and was housed in the Fairmont Cabin; she attended Bluefield Business



College; and has four children, all adults in the medical profession. Charlotte remembers Fanny Newton, wife of Rev. William Francis Newton, both missionary of the Herald of Hope Chapel Car and founder of Quinwood First Baptist Church, as she was a good friend of Charlotte's parents.



We were provided lunch by these gracious ladies – hot dogs from the famous Hilltop Restaurant in Quinwood along with potato salad and Charlotte's homemade Lemon Lush. It was during this luncheon conversation that Kathy Hudson (family roots in neighboring Nicholas County) and Charlotte began to put all the pieces in place and discovered that they are, indeed, distant relatives! What fun it was! After that, we drove down the hill from the church to where the Quinwood Railroad Depot was located and where the Herald of Hope Chapel Car once stood. According

to the information in a book entitled <u>Herald of Hope</u> by Nancy Richmond, the Herald of Hope was relocated in 1932 to nearby Marfrance where it was placed on a stone foundation and used as a church for the community. We also visited that site. The Chapel Car stayed there until 1939 when a new church was built. It was then retired from service and sold to Imperial Smokeless Coal Company and moved back to Quinwood where it was used as the mine office until the closure of the company. It was then side railed on the tracks and stood empty for several years. The Herald of Hope was eventually scrapped and the chapel car passed into history, but its legacy lives on in many facets and especially those that involve meeting new sisters in Christ. Thank you, Charlotte Johnson, for an unforgettable adventure!

Are you a New Year's resolution kind of person? I'm usually not one myself, but this really helped me as I started the 2019 year. Last year I made a card and put it on my bathroom mirror. It is the first thing I see in the morning and the last thing at night. I've updated it for 2020 and want to share it with you. It helps me start the day and end the day in prayer. Many of our New Year's resolutions fall flat simply because we do not make them in Jesus' name. We make them in our own name, in our own strength, on our terms, for our personal gain and benefit. They fail by February because they're so focused on us - on self.

Christian resolutions and disciplines are not about self-fulfillment or self-preservation, but about increasing our capacity to *die* to self as part of being born again; the old self dies and the new self comes to life (John 3:3–7).

What makes Christian "self-improvement" any different than any other self-help? The "self" being improved suddenly becomes a servant to others! A humble, intentional, joyful worker for others' joy in Jesus. The Apostle Paul could have said, "Make no personal growth resolutions from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others" (Philippians 2:3-4). Personal development is about being the best "you" possible. Expand your skills, gifts and talents as you study and grow. "Investing in yourself is the best investment you will ever make. It will not only improve your life; it will improve the lives of all those around you." When you accepted Christ, you began a journey. This journey will



continue all your life. Our personal growth is the evidence of God's work in our lives. As we look to Jesus, the transformation that has happened spiritually will begin to manifest itself in us in tangible and practical ways. We will change and grow, becoming more and more like the One we follow.

The motivation for personal development is created when you realize that you want more as you are going through a life transition. We live in the information age. We can access the information we need to learn anything in seconds, but information isn't enough. Without inspiration and revelation, information is just noise. The process of personal development cuts through that noise. This development is more than doing more: it is also about doing less. While you likely will need to study God's word and adopt new ways of thinking, you will also need to let go of old ideas, thoughts and patterns in order to grow more fully.

As we envision this new year let's stop for a minute and check our vision. Do we have 20/20 vision? Do we need a checkup? If we are experiencing problems, we might need corrective lenses or even more drastic corrective measures. The good news is: when our vision isn't 20/20, it is correctible. Let's start this year in prayer as we continue our own individual and unique journey of personal development as we travel the same road. *"As Christians, remember that: Earth is (our place of work) and Heaven is (our retirement)."*
