The West Virginia Baptist Convention is a family of churches committed to the mission of *Doing Christ's Work Together*.



mountain state MISSION OFFERING

In his inaugural address before the Baptist Missionary Society in 1792, William Carey famously preached, “Expect great things from God; attempt great things for God!” As we embark on a new year, we hope to reemphasize Carey’s challenge as we expect and attempt great things for God over our next decade of *Doing Christ’s Work Together*.

Carey also knew that no matter what he attempted, he could not do it alone. Prior to the formation of the Baptist Missionary Society, he found himself pleading for the financial support of fellow pastors. Likening his vision of taking the gospel to India to that of a rescue mission into a deep, dark well, he suggested, “I will go down if you will hold the rope.” His fellow pastors agreed to become rope holders and they commissioned Carey and his small team to India, where they spent the rest of their lives planting churches, translating the Bible and reaching thousands with the gospel.

Every year, thousands are also being reached through the ministries of the West Virginia Baptist Convention. However, it is only sustainable if individuals and churches continue to hold the rope. As we head into this next decade of ministry together, and as we continue to provide more opportunities for Gospel outreach, the question for you is: ***Will you commit to holding the rope?***


Auxiliary Ministries

Retired Ministers and Mates

The Retired Ministers and Mates hosts an annual luncheon for retired professional church leaders and their spouses on the first Tuesday in October, compliments of the Ministers and Missionaries Benefit Board—featuring fellowship, worship, music, updates by the WVBC Executive Minister, a report on the financial status of the retirement portfolio and a memorial service.



West Virginia Baptist Education Society



Since its formation, the West Virginia Baptist Education Society has offered more than 1,500 loans and scholarships to college and seminary students, many of whom have served internationally or within our family of churches. Financial assistance is available for anyone who is a member of a WVBC church and is preparing to serve in ministry.

Bobby Wood School of Christian Studies



West Virginia Baptist Historical Society

The West Virginia Baptist Historical Society was formed in 1940 to maintain historical records and preserve our past. Now maintained in a fire-proof, climate-controlled vault at Parchment Valley Conference Center, this museum and library continues to collect articles and photographs to help us remember our rich heritage.



The School of Christian Studies has been equipping saints for ministry since 1993. Founder Bobby Wood dreamt that the school would train and equip pastors who would not otherwise have access to training. When the school began, nearly 70% of our pastors were bivocational and only 3% of them had training. Today, more than 700 people have been trained for ministry and, in many associations, nearly all of our pastors have received training.

The School offers two- and three-year programs for Teaching Certificates, Certificates in Lay Ministry, Diplomas in Pastoral Ministry, and Certificates in General Studies. Each course is less than \$40 with an optional \$10 add-on for spouses.

Mentoring for Pastoral Excellence



Launched in 2020, in partnership with Renew Transformational Strategies, the Mentoring for Pastoral Excellence program hopes to inspire, encourage, support and strengthen networks between experienced pastor-mentors and gifted younger pastors in our churches. The mentoring program lasts for ten months and is tailored to fit each mentor/leader pairing. Participants also attend a conference for further growth and networking within the program.

The program costs \$1,200 a year, which covers the cost of 12 mentoring sessions and the annual conference. Grants are available to help cover the cost of the program.

Weirton Christian Center



Weirton Christian Center serves God and community by providing children a strong foundation by meeting their spiritual, physical and emotional needs. For over 100 years, the Center has offered many Christ-centered community outreach and development programs, including a preschool program, a free afterschool program, a feeding program and multiple summer camps.

Pastor4Pastors: WV Baptist Minister's Council

The West Virginia Baptist Ministers' Council provides fellowship among the ministers of the WVBC. It provides opportunities for education, inspiration, personal/professional growth, and encourages pastors and churches to maintain healthy relationships in ministry.





The mission of the American Baptist Women's Ministries of West Virginia (ABWMWV) is to encourage all women and girls to worship God, grow spiritually, develop spiritual gifts, care for one another and reach out to others. They achieve this through annual mission projects, coordinated Bible reading plans, a scholarship program for college-aged girls and numerous retreats and conferences throughout the year.

Made up of more than 100 local ABWMWV groups in individual churches, the state ABWM group is committed to making disciples around the world.

The Ministry Internship Program lets individuals explore their call to ministry by giving them an opportunity to serve within our family of churches and placing them under the guidance of a mentor for a summer internship. The internship opportunities are customizable to the interests of the applicant. Previous internship placements include pastoral ministry, youth ministry, worship ministry, media ministry or intercultural ministry.

Since its conception in 2017, this ministry has continued to expand and has led to permanent placements for several of our interns.

West Virginia Baptist Camp at Cowen



The mission of Camp Cowen is to be a place “where people meet Jesus and grow as His disciples in a community of faith.” Nearly every summer since 1943, this has been the case for the close to 2,000 youth who show up each year. Making memories that last a lifetime, campers quickly meet new friends, sing fun songs around the campfire, play a bunch of games and deepen their relationship with Christ through daily devotions and small group Bible studies.

Thousands have given their lives to Christ at Camp Cowen, and hundreds more have accepted a call into ministry, making this one of our most important ministries in reaching the next generation.

American Baptist Men of West Virginia



The American Baptist Men of WV strive to bring men into a relationship with Jesus Christ and encourage them to practice ministry at home, work, in their local church and in their community. They also aim to broaden men’s understanding of the mission of the WVBC by supporting its mission programs and cooperating churches.

Every year, their Disaster Relief Team sends volunteers to help people in need around the state and across the country. The team has repaired churches and homes after floods, fires, storms and economic disasters. All work done comes at no cost to the homeowners.

Area Ministry



Area Ministers serve as the primary point of contact for the associations, churches and pastors with the larger WVBC family. They work with pulpit committees and church leaders to find pulpit supply, interims and pastors, and they act as consultants in the pastor-search process. They help pastors and churches as guides in the licensing and ordination process, and they provide advice and help for leaders seeking training.

Area Ministers assist churches with conflict resolution and can provide advice on church structure, growth and strategy. The Area Ministers of the WVBC also regularly join churches for celebrations, dedications and other key moments in church life.

Parchment Valley Conference Center



Built by generous volunteers, Parchment Valley Conference Center has been used to equip and train spiritual leaders for more than 50 years. It is the home of numerous conferences, camps and training events. It is also the home of our West Virginia Palmer Seminary program. Built to be a place “where lives are changed,” more than 700 people have placed their faith in Christ here over the last decade.

Parchment Valley also has an incredible outreach to the Jackson County community, including their annual Brothers’ Keeper program, which has repaired more than 1,000 homes over the last 20 years.



The WVBC Children's Ministry is reaching children in kindergarten through fifth grade by providing two children's rallies a year, one in the fall and one in the spring. The rallies provide a time for children and their church leaders to learn and grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ.

Various training opportunities for children's ministry workers are also provided by the WVBC Children's Ministry throughout the year. One particular training that is offered is on the topic of safeguarding children, where churches are trained on how to develop policies, plan safe environments for children and implement background checks for all volunteers.

Since our formation in 1865, the WVBC has commissioned 41 different full-time missionaries. Every year, we also send out hundreds of short-term missionaries to more than 20 different countries around the world.

The WVBC has dedicated staff who provide mission trip leader training, assistance with raising support and resources for mission education. They also host an annual family missions camp, Camp Global, that is designed to inform, inspire and equip individuals and churches to better engage in what God is doing in His redemption of the nations.




The Missionary Internship Program enables individuals to explore their calling to missions by pairing them with one of our long-term missionary partners for a three- to six-week summer internship. Once an applicant is accepted into the program, the WVBC staff works with them to place them according to their interests and geographical preference.

Applicants are expected to raise the full amount needed for their internship with training from the Convention. They also participate in several additional training events on missiology, culture and conflict resolution. Each of these training sessions are led by experienced global missions personnel and coordinated by the WVBC staff.

The WVBC Senior Adult Ministry is reaching adults over the age of 55 by providing two Golden'eers retreats per year, one in the spring and one in the fall, which provides a time of fellowship, in-depth Bible Study and a variety of entertainment. The retreat provides a time to grow in meaningful relationship with Jesus and in relationship with others in God's family.

A new ministry that is also beginning is Intentional Grandparenting. Recognizing how incredibly important grandparents are to their grandchildren, this ministry is designed to come alongside grandparents to help equip them to better spiritually influence and disciple their grandchildren.



Since its formation in 1967, Baptist Campus Ministry has spread to nine campuses across the state, reaching out to students at Marshall, WVU, WVU Tech, University of Charleston, Concord, Alderson Broaddus, Glenville State, Fairmont State, and Potomac State. Students gather once a week for worship, prayer, Bible study and fellowship. BCM students from across the state also gather for multiple retreats and conferences throughout the year.

BCM's mission is to "change lives that change the world" by equipping students to serve as leaders within our family of churches and alongside our international mission partners.

Doing Christ's Work Together knows no language or cultural boundaries. Two WVBC churches grew from church plants ministering to West Virginia's Hispanic populations. Comunidad Nueva Esperanza* (CNE) in Ravenswood and Comunidad Luz y Vida** (CLV) in Moorefield minister to Spanish-speaking individuals who moved to the state seeking employment, primarily in the agriculture and poultry processing industries.

Partnering with other churches in the Convention is important to the ongoing outreach and ministries of CNE and CLV. Both churches receive support and resources through long-established WVBC churches in their areas.

**Community of Light and Life



The WVBC Youth Ministry exists to come alongside churches to disciple middle school and high school youth as they grow in their walks with Christ.

The Youth Leadership Core (YLC) is a small group of church-nominated high school sophomores and juniors who gather throughout the school year to develop not only their relationships with Christ but also their leadership skills.

The Youth Ministry Planning Team (YMPT) is a group of church-nominated juniors and seniors who plan four discipleship events spanning the duration of each school year: Fall Rally, Junior High Convention, Senior High Convention and Omega.



Partnering – Planting – Revitalizing – Restarting

Planting new churches is a priority for our WVBC family. Thousands of people across the state are unreached with the gospel. WVBC's New Church Development initiative finds new and innovative ways to invite these unreached people into a relationship with Christ and create a community in which they can grow and serve.

This program also provides guidance and resources to struggling churches so they can once again become healthy and vibrant faith communities. When a church is approaching the need to close its doors, the program helps them find new life through restarts.
