

As I write this page for Seasons, it is the weekend before Holy Week - a time in which we stop and make a conscious effort to remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, taking on the sin of the world, our own sin, upon Himself to become the sacrificial lamb and die on the cross in our place. The symbol of the cross is our constant reminder of the great gift God gave the world on the day His Son was crucified. *"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."* John 3:16 NKJV

I try to let God lead me in what I should say to my sisters in Christ and fellow servants in American Baptist Women's Ministries. I was drawn to the verses at the top of the page. I started dissecting the verses and searching for what God wanted me to glean from His word. I put words in ALL CAPS where I thought God was taking me. The scripture focuses on how we are equipped for our calling as believers in our spiritual ministries. We are expected to grow in our faith through spiritual disciplines of prayer and reading and meditating on God's word. Christ is the head of the whole body and we as believers are expected to do our share for the growth of the body. Perfect message for the president to share! There, I am done!

But the word "edifying" kept blinking like a neon sign. So I took the time to look it up. The word used for "edification" in the New Testament is *oikodomé*, which translates literally as "the building of a house." "Mutual edification involves helping one another along the road to Christlikeness, and **it requires the participation of all members of the church.** Without mutual edification, the church becomes a collection of spiritual weaklings, a perpetual nursery for spiritual infants, rather than a body (<u>1 Corinthians 12:27</u>) or a building (Ephesians 2:20-22)." (gotquestions.org) Wow!

**Now the analogy**: The Gothic arch was a very popular structure in medieval architecture. The primary advantage of the arch was its strength and stability, which it derived from the fact that **each stone in the arch leaned on the one beside it.** The Gothic arch could be a symbol of the church. The very fact that we need one another gives the church its strength. And the minute we decide to stop leaning on one another, we fall. Do you see a church window in the Gothic arch? Hmmm ... not a coincidence!

will find the original location of the office for PVCC has moved from one end of the barn location to the other end, which overlooks the grounds.

This handicapped restroom facility meets the specifications of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and is easily accessible to those who may have

special needs. It is all automatic - from the opening of the 40" wide door that can accommodate a wheelchair, the lighting, the flushing of the toilet, the sink and the release of the hand towels at the wave of the hand. Congratulations on a job well done!

COVID-19 hit everyone in early spring 2020, preventing Women's Ministries groups and churches from meeting. The yearly cycle for this ministry was changed in 2019 from June through June to January through December to coincide with other ABWM ministries. This report reflects the information received from June 2019 through December 2020.

# **2021 Mission Outreach Project**

# House of Hope Medical / Dental Clinic Bolivia

The goal of this project is to provide dental equipment, medications and vitamins to care for over 800 people in Cochabamba, Bolivia. In Bolivia, only children under five-years-old get health

coverage. Almost 85% of dental cavities in adults and children go untreated. Access to healthcare is very difficult and indigenous communities are at high risk for completely preventable diseases such as diarrhea and chronic malnutrition.

The House of Hope in Cochabamba partners with local doctors and dentists to bring mobile clinics to serve vulnerable populations in the city and surrounding provinces. Your support will provide equipment and supplies for two mobile dental clinics and one medical clinic in Cochabamba, Bolivia. These clinics will provide needed medical and dental care on a regular

basis. Through education and screening, this project will prevent diseases and provide local churches with outreach opportunities for ministry to their local communities.

The House of Hope mobile dental clinic will provide care and prevention to 800 people, resulting in improved oral health. The mobile medical clinic will provide annual care to 500 people, resulting in improved overall health in vulnerable populations. These clinics give House of Hope the chance to build relationships with Bolivian doctors and dentists through monthly meetings that build community among the volunteers and offer evangelism and discipleship opportunities. Pray these clinics will have long-term spiritual impact that will bring about true shalom in the community. Pray these clinics will bring improved health for hundreds of children, men and women.

#### <u>West Virginia State Sales Tax</u> <u>Conference and Spiritual Growth Retreat</u>

Yes, we do have to charge sales tax for our events. There are two ways you can handle this:

- 1. You can bite the bullet and pay the tax that will be included on your registration form for calculation based on your event cost or
- 2. You can bypass paying the tax by doing the following:
  - Have your church send a **yearly** tax exempt form to the state office in Parkersburg.
  - Write your check for the event amount to your church and give it to your church treasurer.
  - Ask your church treasurer to issue a check for the event amount made payable to ABWM of WV.
  - Fill out your registration form (do not calculate sales tax if check is being issued by your church) and attach the check your church has written or put a note on the form that the check is coming from your church (name) and send it directly to the state ABWM registrar, Carrie Gasaway (451 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, Dunbar, WV 25064) not to the state office.
  - Nothing goes to the state office except your church's tax exempt form.
  - The sales tax has already been calculated on the 2021 Conference Registration Form.

#### APRIL BIBLE BOOK OF THE MONTH - ZECHARIAH



Zechariah (meaning Yahweh Remembers) was the 11th of the 12th minor prophets in the Bible. Most other Bible prophets lived before God punished the Jews by exiling them to Assyria and Babylon, in what is now Iraq. The earlier prophets warned the Jews where they were headed if they didn't stop sinning. Those prophets did offer hope though, promising that God would bring the Jews home one day.

Zechariah lived after the exile. The Jews are back in their homeland, rebuilding their nation. But 18 years after their return they are still struggling. They were under the shadow of Persia, a superpower at that time, and were treated like a providence of Persia, not the independent nation of Judah. Farming and herding are tough jobs in the best of times and according to the book of Haggai there was a drought going on. Because of their circumstances they felt distant from God. There was no temple in which to seek God's help. They were in desperate need of good news and Zechariah, through visions and prophecies, delivers just that. He promises God is in control and he will help them finish the temple.

Although Zechariah and Haggai spoke to the remnant of Israel in God's commission at the same time, Zechariah's message was a totally different one. While Haggai had to rebuke the people most of the time because their zeal for the building of the temple wearied, Zechariah speaks more of the city of Jerusalem. He is the only post-exile prophet to give a detailed overview on the history of God's people and the nations connected with Jerusalem.

The Book of Zechariah not only looks at the present situation in which the people were rebuilding the temple. He describes the rejection of the Messiah by His earthly people Israel and their repentance and acknowledgment of the Messiah who will appear to establish His reign of peace. It looks forward to a day when God's sovereignty will be recognized throughout the world and all peoples. Jews and Gentiles will come and worship the Lord.

Zechariah 1-6 records eight dreams or visions from the LORD. For further personal development read and study them.

- 1. The horseman among the myrtle trees (1:7-17)
- 2. The four horns and four craftsmen (1:18-21)
- 3. The surveyor (2:1-13)
- 4. The vision of Joshua the high priest (3:1-10)
- 5. The golden lampstand and two olive trees (4:1-14)
- 6. The flying scroll (5:1-4)
- 7. The woman in the basket (5:5-11)
- 8. The four chariots (6:1-8)

"Thus says the Lord of hosts, Render true judgments, show kindness and mercy to one another, do not oppress the widow, the fatherless, the sojourner, or the poor, and let none of you devise evil against another in your heart." (Zechariah 7:9–10, ESV)

When we embrace the five requirements of these two verses, the world will change. As we reflect on the year 2020 and all the ways we accomplished old things in a new way, we have a list that is too long and occasionally too painful to cover in this short space. Let us consider that sometimes we get a little consumed with what God can do for us. He does great things for us because He loves us so much. But there is an expressed expectation of what He requires from His people. Let's continue in prayer as we travel our own individual and unique journey of personal development on the same road together.
