Joni Eareckson Tada should inspire us all. In 1967, at the age of 17, a very athletic young girl with all kinds of plans for her future takes a dive into a lake that leaves her quadriplegic, changing her life and journey forever. Her story of depression, anger and finding the faith and spirit to fight on will inspire you. She became publicly known at first about her ability to write and draw just using her mouth. As she continued to share

her faith journey, she started a program helping families with disabilities in the 80's morphing into *Joni and Friends*, a weekly radio program providing encouragement, biblical insights and disability awareness, which continues to this day in podcasts, on Facebook and YouTube, etc. She, with the help of her husband, Ken, have started many foundations to help those with disabilities and has also written multiple books to inspire us all.



Now, before we think what an amazing person she is, Joni and her husband, Ken, talk openly about their struggles. Joni has battled breast cancer, constant pain, lung issues and recently she and Ken both had COVID-19. In *A Place of Healing: Wrestling with the Mysteries of Suffering, Pain, and God's Sovereignty* she writes "He has chosen not to heal me, but to hold me. The more intense the pain, the closer His embrace." The openness of Joni and her husband will encourage and remind all of us she is a regular woman of faith who can inspire us all to have

extraordinary faith.



Reproduced from the New International Version (NIV) Leadership Bible

A woman without a family in either Moab or Israel was a desolate and vulnerable creature. Naomi was such a woman. After three heart-rending funerals, she was left with no husband and no sons to protect her from the perils of widowhood. As miserable as life would be in her home town of Bethlehem, she decided going home would be easier than staying in Moab. So she left Moab and headed home. Her two widowed daughters-in-law followed her, but Naomi encouraged them

to go back, explaining the implications of being an unattached older woman in Bethlehem. These two women were young enough to start over; it was foolish for them to tie themselves to her. Orpah listened and returned home, but not Ruth. Read the account in Ruth 1:19-21.

Notice two things about this story. First, Naomi was a realist. She didn't turn lemons into lemonade. God had dealt her a bitter hand, and unless she acknowledged her situation for what it was, she wouldn't be able to play that hand intelligently. But also notice although Naomi did acknowledge her situation was bitter, she didn't say she was bitter. Her attitude is revealed by Ruth's response to



her. After a frank discussion of reality, Ruth still wanted to stay with her mother-in-law. She was willing to live within a foreign culture so that that could be with Naomi. Naomi had received some hard knocks, but she had not become hard.



choice and her life drew others to God.

Read Ruth's expression of her loyalty to Naomi in verses 1:16-17. People don't make that kind of commitment to an angry, vindictive old woman. Ruth's response is a telling commentary on Naomi's own response to her bitter situation.

A final observation: God had taken Naomi's husband and two sons. Her hopes for a pleasant life had ben dashed. All Ruth knew about the God of Israel was learned from the manner in which Naomi had responded to him after the deaths of her husband and sons. But this observation was enough for Ruth to avow that "your God [will be] my God." Wow! Naomi's reaction to her

tragedy had actually drawn this young Gentile woman to want to know God. Please take the time to read the rest of the story, which ends with Naomi holding Ruth's baby in her lap. God was assembling the players from whose combined blood lines his own Son would be born, and faithful Naomi was an integral part of his plan. Because Naomi responded as she did, the name Ruth appears in the genealogy of Jesus Christ. When life got bitter, Naomi had a choice. She could become bitter or she could trust God. Naomi made the right



Mid-Year Status



From his book *Insights on Luke*. Excerpt from Gabriel's Heavenly Dialogue (From My Journal) page 47-48

The problem of sin and evil creates a unique difficulty. Transgression of God's laws decrees that reflect His very character - must carry a penalty or the laws are meaningless. Therefore, to simply set aside the penalty of sin would require the Lord to deny His very character. Yet to eradicate sin would destroy the sinner.

Gabriel and the other angels probably struggled to understand the Lord's extraordinary efforts to redeem sinful humanity, and they may have found His plan equally perplexing. If the Lord were to explain why God must become a man in order to redeem humanity, I imagine the conversation might go something like this:

Unable to resolve the dilemma, Gabriel asked, "How will you destroy sin and preserve the people?"

The Lord glowed with pleasure at the opportunity to reveal the next detail of His plan. "I will provide a substitute - someone to pay the penalty of sin on their behalf."

"But who?" I protested, "How can someone pay for the sins of another if he dies paying for his own?"

"A very astute question," he answered. "The substitute must not have any sin of his own."

I was even more perplexed. "But Lord, the substitute would have to be a human in order to represent humanity, yet all of humanity has been infected with evil. Furthermore, this substitute would have to be superhuman in order to pay the penalty for all people, to die a death that would cover not just one sinner's penalty, but that of the whole multitude! What substitute can possibly suffice?"

After a short silence, God said, "God."

I stood dumbfounded. It didn't seem possible. And if it were, it didn't seem fair. Indeed, it wasn't! This was grace. So characteristic of Him, yet utterly beyond my ability to comprehend.

He continued, "I will send My eternal Son to be the Messiah. He will be the substitute. The Messiah will not be the son of a sinful, eartly father, but My Son, born of a virgin to preserve His sinlessness. The Messiah will be man. The Messiah will be God. Being the God-man, He will represent humankind, yet He will have no sin. Furthermore, after He dies on behalf of all humankind, He will conquer death by rising from the grave."

I could not speak. The perfection of His plan - so ingenious, so simple, so intricate - left me even more amazed than seeing Him create the universe with a mere word.
