

# Syllabus New Testament I

### (B-03 - Twelve Hour) Six-Week Class

### **Course Requirements:**

- Class attendance and participation. (No more than one absence without make-up.)
- -- Read pages 1-232 in the text. New Testament II (B-04) will cover the remainder of the book.
- Choose one personality or issue and write a paper giving the requirements listed below.
- -- Payment of all fees.
- -- Complete any other assignments as given by the instructor.

The text we are using for this course lends itself to be broken down into four sections, following the heading of the book.

New Testament I (B-03) will include Part 1 and Part 2 and New Testament II (B-04) will be centered on Part 3 and 4.

Students are asked to choose one personality or major issue of the day for New Testament I (B-03) and write a paper giving:

- 1.) The name of the personality or description of the issue
- 2.) A brief history of the personality or events precipitating the issue
- 3.) The major contribution these personality made to Jewish history or how the issue impacted Jewish history and the early church
- 4.) The reason the personality or issue was chosen
- 5.) How the personality or issue impacted New Testament life
- 6.) How the personality or issue has impacted the student's life, as well as the church today

The papers will be discussed during the concluding session of each course.

If an issue is chosen for New Testament I (B-03), a personality must be chosen for New Testament II (B-04) and vice versa.
