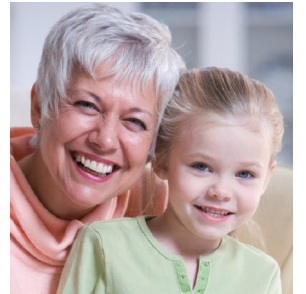
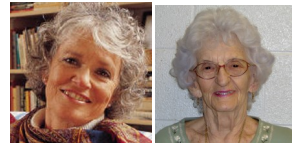

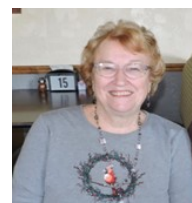

2022 Goal - \$100,000 (NOT JUST FOR WOMEN . . .)

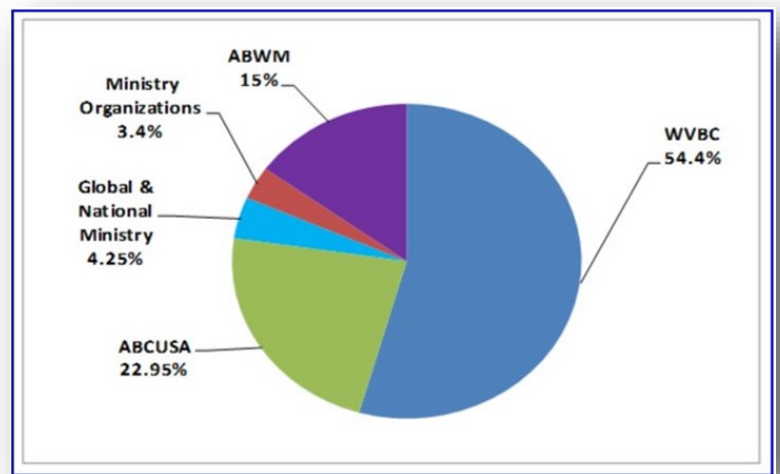

LOVE GIFT DISTRIBUTION

Your Executive Board members earlier this year suggested a reorganization of changing National Support dollars collected statewide to either an in-state ministry, WV Hope Project, a local ministry, or a ministry affiliated with ABWM. We offered several explanations and scenarios, but it now appears there is mass confusion about this.

I will try to explain our reasoning behind the board's decision in further detail. If you will look at the Love Gift Distribution spreadsheet on the opposite page, you will see columns for each entity that receives funding from your Love Gift giving.

If you will look at ABC-USA (the fifth column across the page), under that column heading you will see the amounts that ABWM Love Gift has given to the American Baptist Churches USA (National) each and every year since 1985. The years are listed in the first column. By simply going across the page from the year, you will see how much money we sent to them for that year. If you look at the last entry for 2021, across the page to the ABC-USA column, you will see that we gave \$16,838.51 to that national office.

Likewise, the third column is ABWM National Support. If you go across the page from 2021 to column three, you will see that we gave \$11,005.56 in Love Gift money to that national office. And, of course, per the binding agreement, 54% of Love Gift money stays here in West Virginia. Again, 2021 across the page to the last column shows that Love Gift monies in the amount of \$39,913.51 were given to the West Virginia Baptist Convention.

The percentage listed under the heading for each column is how Love Gift is divided among the five titled columns on the spreadsheet. The year is in the first column, the total amount collected through Love Gift is the second column and the remainder are the ministries to which it is distributed. This is a legally-binding agreement between ABC-USA and the West Virginia Baptist Convention and cannot be altered in any way.

The bottom line is this: If you feel the West Virginia American Baptist Women should donate more towards national support than what is listed on this spreadsheet, then by all means, collect as your group sees fit. Send the non-Love Gift money to your State Treasurer, Amy Starkey, Whispering Pines Lane, Ravenswood, WV 26164 and she will see that it gets to the WVBC office for proper distribution.

In any event, please promote Love Gift giving as this ministry supports national, international and in-state ministries.

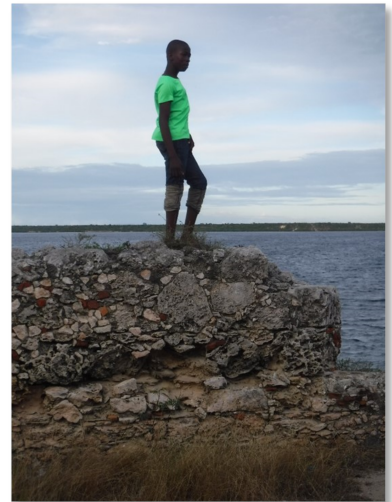

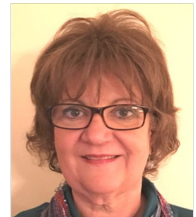


“Project Good Samaritan”
