

Michael Beck - Keynote Speaker

Michael is the Director of Re-Missioning for Fresh Expressions, Director of Fresh Expressions Florida, and the Director Fresh Expressions House of Studies at United Theological Seminary US. A fresh expression is, in its simplest form, a pattern for believers to share their faith in their everyday lives. Fresh expressions are about getting creative in your church's reach. Michael and his wife, Jill, actively participate in thirteen Fresh Expressions that are a product of the local church where he is pastor. These take place in places such as dog parks, salons, running tracks, community centers, burrito joints, and tattoo parlors. He and Jill have 8 children, 4 grandchildren and 2 pugs.

Jonathan is a WV native who has been pastoring in Lewisburg at Shuck Memorial Baptist Church for the past twelve years. He is a graduate of Eastern University and Palmer Theological Seminary. Ministers' Wives' Fellowship—\$12




Outreach to the Nicholas County Community Day Reporting Center

The following offerings will be collected during the WVBC Annual Meeting.

Pastor Emergency Fund

Convention Rules

The following rules are extracted from the West Virginia Baptist Convention Constitution.

- 1. The voting membership shall consist of the Convention Officers and the pastor and two delegates from each cooperating member church, and one additional delegate for each one hundred members or major fraction thereof above the first one hundred members from each such church shall be entitled to no more than ten delegates plus the pastor in this class. Members must be present to vote; proxy and absentee voting shall not be permitted.
- 2. The voting membership from a Cooperating member church which chooses to relate to its local Association and the Convention, but not to the American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A., shall have full voting privileges except they may not vote on matters relating to the "Covenant of Relationships" between the Convention and the American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. or the election of American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. General Board members. These voting privileges and restrictions shall also apply to Executive Board and Executive Committee members.
- 3. Only church and "ex-officio" delegates, displaying their registration badges may make motions, speak, or vote at Convention business sessions. Delegates may speak only once, and then for not more than two minutes, on any motion under discussion. The Convention may waive this provision by majority vote.
- 4. All business matters to be considered at the Convention meeting must be presented in writing to the President during the introductory business session on the day preceding the annual business session.
- 5. The Convention shall be one session, recessing from meeting to meeting within that session.
- 6. Fifty registered church delegates shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; once established, a quorum shall not be broken by the absence of delegates at that session.
- 7. Questions of parliamentary procedures shall be decided on the basis of the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

 * A complete definition of voting membership is found in Article 1 of the WVBC Constitution and By-laws.
