

Last summer, a mission team from the American Baptist Women's Ministries of WV traveled to Puebla, Mexico, to assist International Ministries global servants Keith and Deborah Myers with the 2024 C.I.C.E.M. National Women's Retreat. The retreat was held June 20-23 and consisted of 32 indigenous women from five different states of Mexico. This retreat was the first ever for the C.I.C.E.M. women!

Official planning for this trip began in 2023 after Nancy Adkins participated in the

WVBC's Short-Term Mission Trip Leader Training. She then recruited a team of eight others who joined her in the planning. During the actual retreat, the desire of the indigenous women to learn and grow in Christ was evident through their stories of travel and struggles to attend. Some traveled over 23 hours on buses to attend the retreat, crossing through dangerous areas. Others attended despite deaths in their family that week, desiring to be with sisters in Christ for peace and understanding.

The beauty of this first event is that these ladies were equipped with lesson plans, craft materials and instructions on how to teach these same workshops and crafts to the women in their communities. Mission trips always have an impact on those who participate in them, but it will also be exciting to watch how God continues to work through the indigenous women of Mexico for many years and decades to come!




